How to use this log

1. Add a row for any word that slowed you down or that you could not define in your own words — from passages, questions, or answer choices.
2. Copy the sentence it appeared in, then write your own definition. If you guessed the meaning from context, note what told you.
3. Come back to the list before the next practice set. Mark a word Used once you have written or said it in a sentence of your own.
